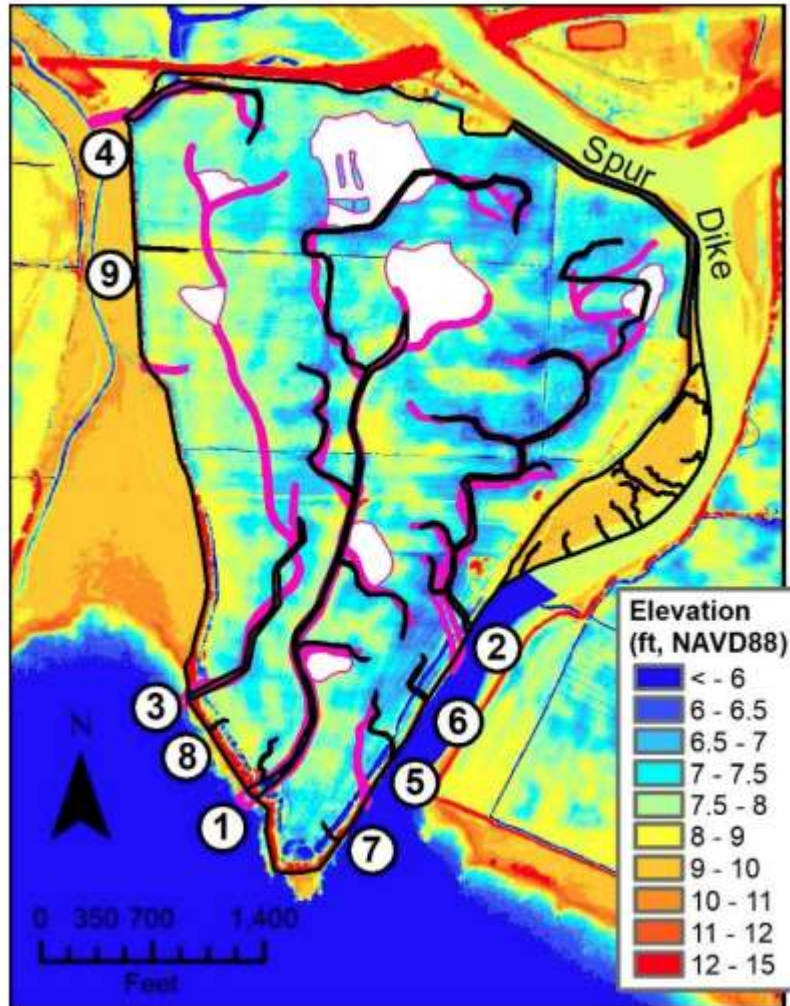
Pacific Coast is a Level II Priority Area for DU

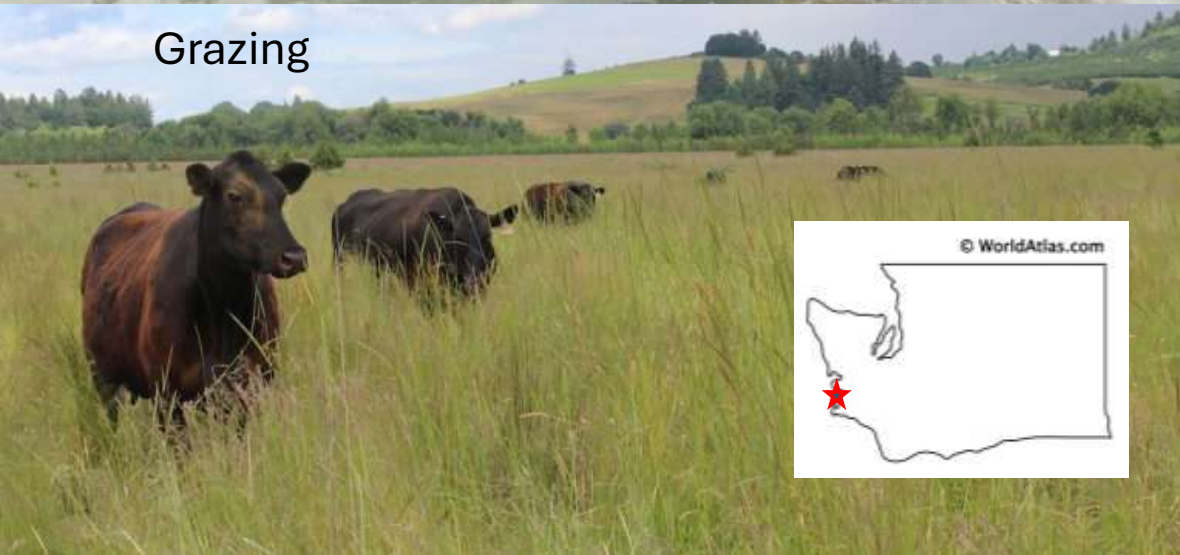
